Macron's meeting with Gentiloni comes after he met with German Chancellor Angela Merkel in Berlin on Monday to draw up a roadmap for deeper EU integration. In the weeks to come, we will have a busy agenda on a number of important issues, the G7, where we are going to talk tonight on a number of topics - climate, migration and all the issues of common interest that we share - . And of course, Europe. On that plan - and we will talk more about it tonight - France's wish is to work very closely with Italy, with Germany, with all the countries that share our values "and Want to move forward in this direction, for a real revival of our European perspectives. First in the short term to work to improve this Europe that protects. I know the challenges that Italy has had to face in terms of migration, we will talk about it. I think that we did not hear the warnings that were launched by Italy. My wish is that we can move towards a genuine reform of the right of asylum and the rules that we have today to better protect the states that are most subject to this migratory pressure and to clarify our common rules."
